We are coming to you in a little different form this time with our News Letter. For some time we have wanted to have it printed so that it would be more easily read and also, so that we might better show you our work by pictures, etc. We have always tried to keep costs down, so have used the old Mimeograph that was given to us. Now we are forced to print because of the number of copies needed and we believe that you will all welcome this change. Our prayer is that God will use COMPASSION to bring information and inspiration, as well as a real challenge to pray for and support the various projects of the Association. Our prayer partners and supporters are living in 49 States, all across Canada and some in foreign lands. (Thousands pray for us daily in Korea!) They are the very life's blood of our work.

God continues to bless and honor our witness and work. In our last letter we told you of four new homes we had taken over the support of in Korea. After two months we are now able to report that we have taken over the support of three more: NEW PROSPERITY CHRISTIAN ORPHANAGE in PUSAN, BETHANY HOME in Kimchun and GREAT GLORY ORPHANAGE in Taegu, with a total of 170 children sponsored. This takes care of all our new sponsors.

However, by faith, we have already promised support, as the Lord provides sponsors, for four more Christian orphanages. Each one is in desperate need and has been investigated and approved by a resident missionary. We have, humanly speaking, "crawled out on a limb" to do this. Yet we believe that God will hear the earnest prayers of those faithful staff members and the dear children who cry out day and night to their Heavenly Father for daily bread, shelter and clothing. We ask that you too pray very earnestly and definitely about this. There are many of you who could become sponsors by sending \$8 a month. Some could take an additional child. Then

we know from past experience that there are many people who would be thrilled to sponsor a child if they only knew about our simple plan. That is where we must ask you to tell your friends, your Sunday School, your Bible Class, your Women's Society, Youth Group, etc. We will be waiting to hear from many—in answer to prayer.
