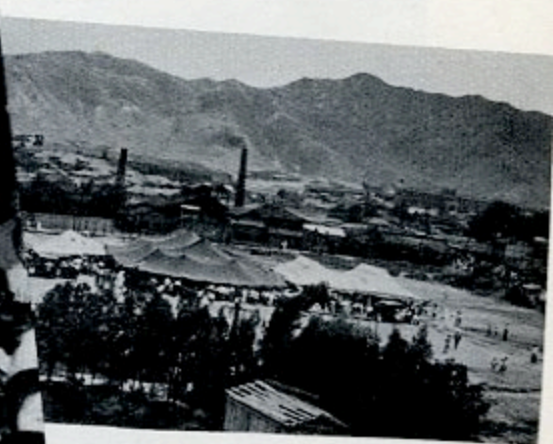

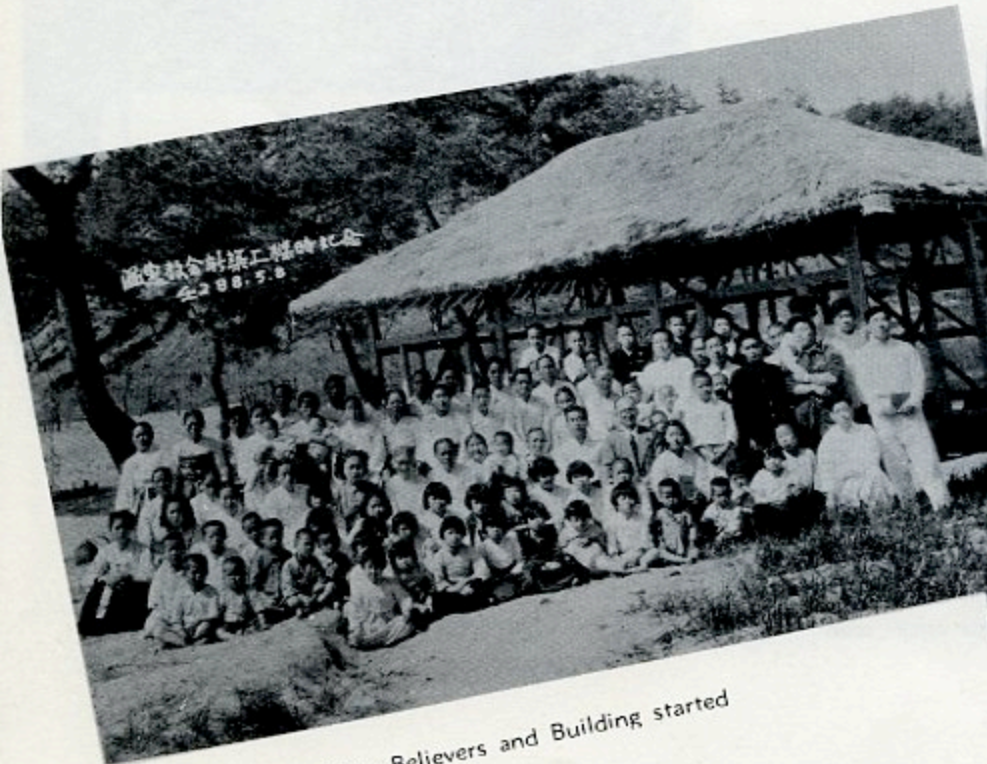

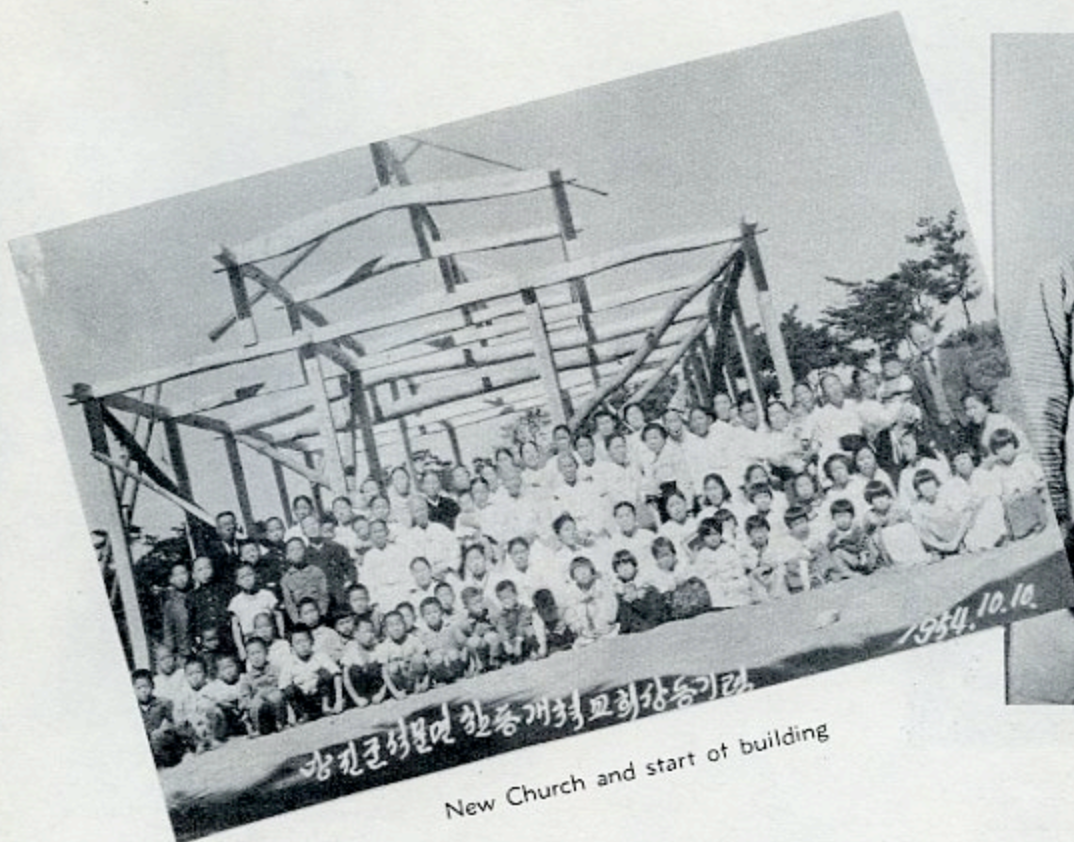

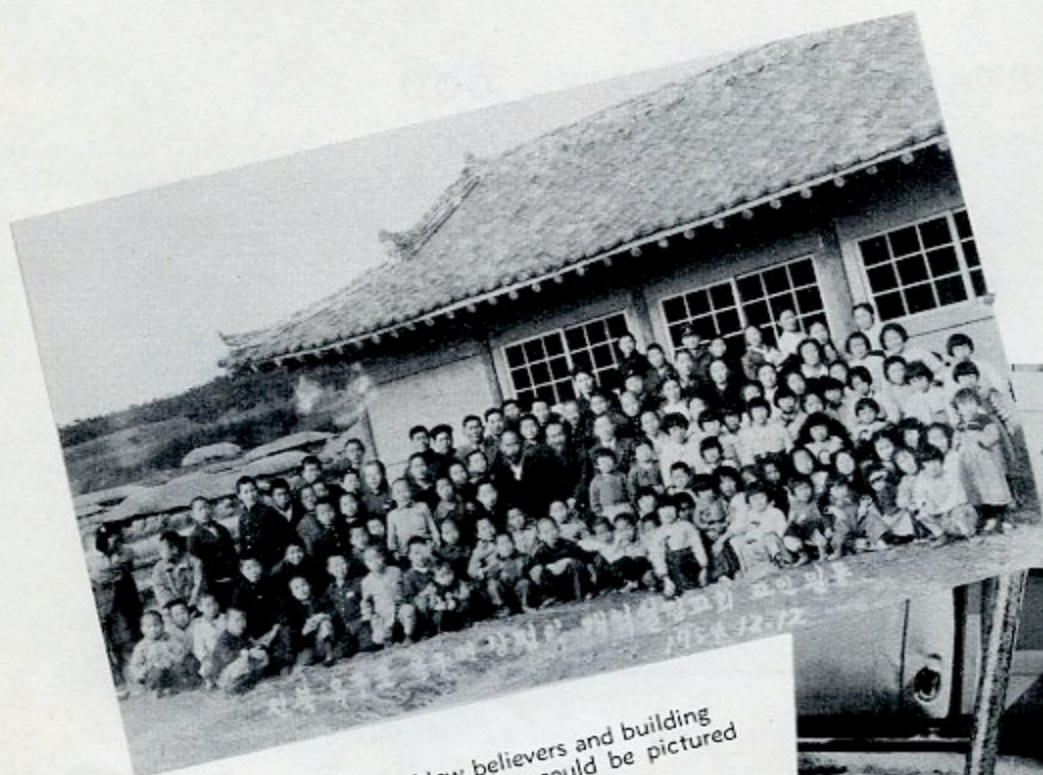

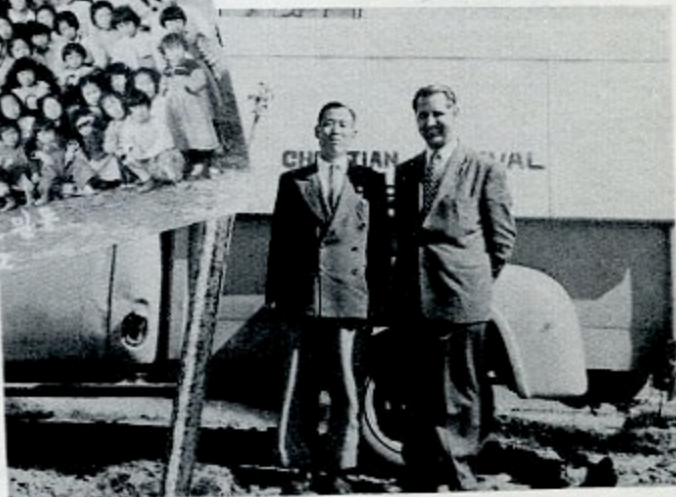

REASONS TO PRAISE GOD

1. In ⁴evangelistic tours has preached to an estimated 850,000 people, military and civilian. Pastors and missionaries report largest attended revival meetings in Korean history. Thousands prayed all night long.

2. Approximately 45,000 have raised hands in "decision to receive Christ."

3. Funds for millions of tracts and gospels.

4. Helped buy building headquarters for Christian Revival Fellowship, Taegu.

5. Full or partial support for about ¹⁰⁰~~50~~ ¹³⁰ full time evangelistic workers (12-18 months), many of whom developed self supporting churches in pioneer areas and built their own building in that time.

6. Funds for 1 Ford truck, 1 Austin truck, and 1 motorcycletruck. Also sound equipment and sound movie projector for use by evangelists.

7. Provided funds to help open or plan 80 Christian book stalls or shops.

8. Built or bought property for ²⁰~~2~~ orphanages and a boys' home for former beggar boys. Total now being wholly or partially supported about ²⁰⁰⁰~~400~~ children. The cost for "adopting" your own child is ⁵⁰~~50~~ a month. Many are needed.

9. Hundreds of packages, many tons of used relief clothing sent for the needy.
