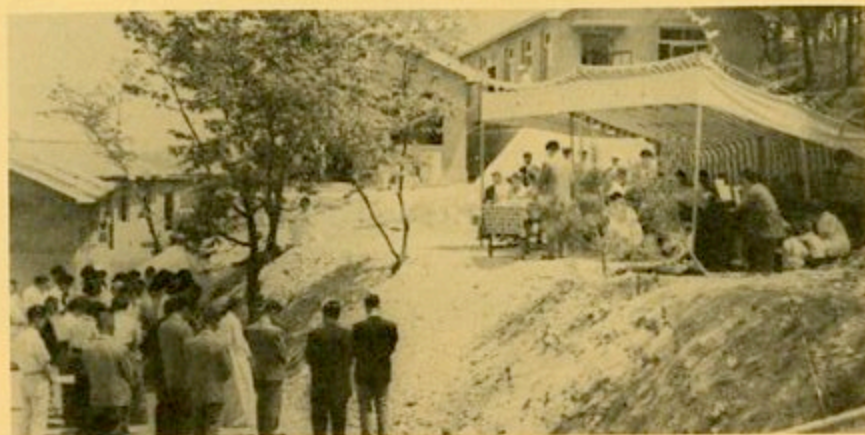

Report on Native Evangelist Work

COMPASSION is now supporting 366 native evangelists in Korea. The supporter agrees to give from \$10 to \$20 per month for a period of two years. We select a man from those who are waiting for our help, and send his picture and full information on his life and work. Generally speaking, a single man receives \$10 and a married man \$20, but this varies according to other factors.

Each month the evangelist sends a personal letter and a detailed report of his services and activities. It is translated in our Seoul office, sent on to Chicago and then to the supporter. The sponsors are thrilled to see their missionary dollars accomplishing so much. Here are some interesting figures taken from one month's reports:

Total new believers one month - 1,428.

In 1962 5,544 special meetings were conducted; 12,219 district cottage prayer meetings held; 178,427 persons were dealt with and witnessed to; 27,360 people were evangelized in street evangelism; 191,726 home visitation evangelism calls were made and 466,329 tracts were distributed. Many new church buildings were built. A total of 10,280 gallons of rice was given in offerings in addition to the small cash offerings. Many of the churches assisted during the year have become self supporting and will continue to evangelize the Buddhists, Confucianists, Shamanists and other heathen people who are living in the bondage of fear, superstition, sin and death. You may have your own native missionary. We still have 43 who are eagerly waiting for help, especially since the famine has caused such hardship in Korea. Many may find it necessary to leave this vital work unless sponsors are obtained *very soon*. If you are interested please write us *today!*

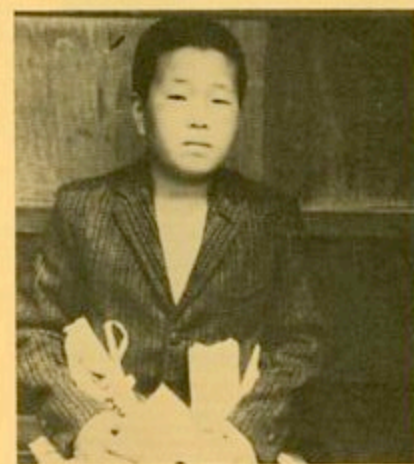

Another APO Mailing Address

This is for sponsors with children in orphanages located in one province only; KYUNG SANG NAMDO, which includes the cities of Pusan, Chin Hae, Masan, Chinju and Choongmoo, as well as towns and rural areas. This address is to be used *only* for GENERAL parcels of used clothing, toys or food, (THESE ITEMS ONLY), and must NOT be used for any individual child. A used clothing drive in your church this Fall would be a wonderful thing. Use - Protestant Chaplain, Hdqts, USAPAC, APO 59, San Francisco, California. Other APO addresses were given in the May-June issue for other areas of Korea. If in doubt, write for complete instructions.

If you are mailing a parcel, BE SURE to mail DIRECTLY to KOREA (Not to our Chicago office) not later than NOVEMBER 1st - EARLIER is much better. Wrap and tie securely, address correctly and INSURE it. Merry Christmas to YOU because you remember the orphan children.

More will be written about this in our next issue of COMPASSION, but we are grateful to all of you who do not wait until the last minute to send gifts through our Chicago office. 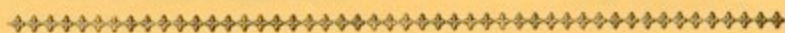
