## WARM PROGRAM RESULTS

### The value of photo packets

We are again enclosing a packet of photos of unsponsored orphan children. These photos have proven to be effective, economical "silent missionaries" when prayerfully used. Many hundreds of needy orphans are being cared for in Compassion orphanages today because someone with a tender heart was moved by one of the photos. Your help is needed, however, in seeing that these photos are shown to prospective sponsors. If you already sponsor an orphan you might want to take a second, as many others have done. We still have hundreds of unsponsored children!

### Thirty-nine tons of milk!

Caring for orphans in more than 170 orphanages is a big job. One seemingly simple item, such as the purchase of milk, involves a major financial transaction. Compassion recently ordered 1400 cases of Dairy Pride full cream powdered milk from Australia, to be shipped to Korea for use in Compassion orphanages.

The total shipment weighed more than 39 tons, and represents a supply for three months. The total cost was \$20,738.20! This is quite a large milk bill, and it could only be paid because of the prayers and gifts of those who have shown compassion on the orphans of Korea.

This is merely one more example of how our many loving sponsors are helping the precious little children in Compassion orphanages in Korea. It seems like such a small amount to sponsor an orphan — only \$10 a month — but it means so much to those in Korea. May God bless each sponsor for his love and compassion.



This young man and his bride were recently married at the Kimpo Farm School. He was an orphan in a Compassion orphanage, and later went to the Compassion operated Kimpo Farm School. He is the first of the Farm School boys to be married. The other boys cooperated in building a simple Korean style (mud brick) house for the new bride and groom!

### IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

A group sponsor in Van Nuys, California is paying the expenses to bring their 15 year old orphan boy to America. Mr. Peter Kang, Korean Director of Compassion, will accompany the boy on the trip. At the present time plans call for them to be in the U.S.A. from about June 15 until September 1. An itinerary of personal appearances will be arranged en route from Los Angeles to Chicago, and from Chicago to New York. Reverend Swanson will be with Mr. Kang and the orphan boy. If you are interested in arranging a meeting in your city please let us know early. This will be a grand opportunity and we want as many sponsors and groups as possible to take advantage of it!



Thanks to the very fine response of thousands of sponsors and friends the 1963 WARM program was the most successful ever. Just look at the photo above! The children are happy and smiling. The staff members are rejoicing also. They are happy and rejoicing because of the warm winter outfits which were so graciously supplied by you.

The photo represents the provision made for the Good Love Orphanage through the WARM program. However, this by no means conveys the full impact of what this program means throughout the other orphanages. Every one of our over twenty thousand needy orphans are warmly dressed at this very moment because of what you have done! For this we give earnest thanks to God.

The response to the WARM program has totaled thus far more than \$96,000 which is greater than any previous year. Actually, we have sent \$98,049 to Korea for the WARM program. It is true that God keeps the final records, but we can only believe that this is the result of the compassion and Christian concern which our sponsors have for needy, precious little children in Korea. B. Chang Duk Chae, Presbyterian, four children ages 4-18. Wants to bring the Gospel to unbelievers. (\$20.00 a month.)



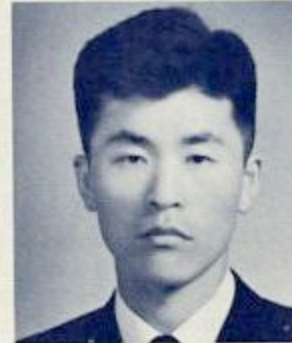
C. Shin Tae Suk, married, Presbyterian, four children ages 2-8. Church meets in a thatched building. (\$20.00 a month.)

E. Lee Yung Ki, single, Methodist. This 27 year old man is dedicated to the Lord Jesus Christ. (\$10.00 a month.)



F. Pak Choon Wha, single, Methodist. This young evangelist is preaching the Gospel to young people. (\$10.00 a month.)



G. Kim Kap Tae, married, Holiness. Ministers to a rural church composed mainly of young married couples. (\$10.00 a month.)



H. Lee Sang Hyung, single, Salvation Army. Ministers in an area where Confucianism is taught. (\$10.00 a month.)



I. Kim Jong Hoi, married, Presbyterian, two children. A former Korean Army Captain preaching Christ. (\$20.00 a month.)

## HOW YOU CAN HELP!

At the present moment we have 67 unsupported evangelists who are eager to preach the Gospel to their fellow Koreans. These dear workers for Christ represent all the major denominations in Korea—Presbyterian, Baptist, Holiness, Salvation Army and Methodist.

The opposite page shows photos of several unsponsored evangelists, together with a brief statement concerning the background of each one. Many friends do not realize that they can provide support for a native evangelist for only \$10 to \$20 a month! Imagine, you can actually sponsor your own missionary for less than a dollar a day. Normally, a single evangelist needs \$10 a month and a married evangelist needs \$20 a month. (The evangelist receives all but 10% which is used to cover translating, postage, and other administrative expense in Chicago and Korea. He can receive the entire amount if you will increase your monthly support by 10%.)

Compassion provides support for native evangelists for a maximum of two years. After this time most of them become self-supporting and have their own church building erected and paid for. But they do need help to get started in the meantime. Of course, if for any reason a sponsor finds he cannot continue support for two years, he need only notify the Chicago office and return the sponsorship papers.

Every evangelist sponsor receives a monthly report on the activity of his worker. These reports bring much blessing as the evangelists tell of God's blessing on their efforts. Just one sentence from one such report will illustrate: ". . . We had a meeting at Chuhghung Church in Wesungkun, Kyungbook with 100 attendants and acquired 56 new souls who newly made up their minds to believe Jesus Christ as their only God and Saviour." (#130 Pak Young Wook)

Surely out of the thousands of Compassion supporters there must be many who are willing to sponsor their own native missionary. We do pray that God will lay this burden heavy on the hearts of many so that the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ may be brought to many more in Korea.
